

ALiSEA : 5 Modalities of Action




1. **Capacity building**: enhances the **capacity of members** to sustain, perform and participate actively in the scaling up of agroecology.

1. **Communication and media outreach**: promote AE to **general public** and enhance **professionals and citizens' journalists** increase the media coverage on agroecology and food issues

1. **Small Grant Facility**: leverage fund to provide it to **ALiSEA members and its partners** to support agroecology transition in the Sub-Mekong Region

1. **Knowledge Management & Hub**: become the leading knowledge resource on agroecology in the Mekong Region

1. **Policy dialogue**: mainstream AE into national and regional strategies to **defend interest of farmers, consumers, environment; influence policy** towards AE implementation







ALiSEA GOVERNANCE & COORDINATION STRUCTURE

The ALiSEA network aims to continue its efforts to structure and consolidate its governance and sustainability as a key step towards achieving autonomy. The governance relies on an adaptive management approach, with flexibility to test innovative mechanisms, adjust and improve the governance arrangement through proofs of concept to integrate members' suggestions and ensure local ownership.

- Members were informed and consulted at each national general assembly




ALiSEA membership evolution






Members involvement: examples from specific key events



What level of engagement would you prefer?


Active participation in discussion and activities: 67%
